In response to Mr Philip Perrott's submission on 8/4/2016 , we, the following undersigned, oppose his submission, making the following points:

- We need to retain public access to the beach in Granity for emergency services. Using the legal access in Granity and the next closest access is three kilometres away at Ngakawau.
- These are the only public access the elderly, disabled, families and fisherman have to the beach in Granity and Ngakawau.
- Very few vehicles use the beach and those that do respect the beach and the environment both along the beach itself as well as the access points.
- It is the custom and practice of local people to access the beach. The beach is used regularly by local people and visitors.
- It is disingenuous to imply that damage has occurred to the Granity beach and its environment by vehicles as very few vehicles use this beach.
- It is also disingenuous to imply that local people are not environmentally aware and do not care. The local people have for a long time undertaken work on the beach and its environment by replanting flora to combat erosion.
- It is also disingenuous to suggest that vegetation has been removed. Indeed, vegetation has been removed by ongoing sea erosion. A fact which NIWA and WCRC have both acknowledged as being problematic to the Granity, Ngakawau and Hector communities.
- There is no evidence that commercial driftwood harvesting is a widespread activity. Local people do take a very small amount of driftwood for their own consumption, predominantly for home heating. This cannot be called a commercial operation and has been an accepted custom and practice that has gone on for decades.
- To imply that local people are damaging the local seafood beds is also erroneous. Mussels live on rocks which 4 wheel cars cannot drive over and the pipi beds are under the water. What one does see are empty pipi shells washed up by the tide.
- If this is enforced, this will have implications for other councils (foreshore and seabed) in New Zealand.

In summary, Mr Perrot's submission appears to be based on emotion and not on fact. He also appears not to understand how the local community has looked after the beach and the access to the beach for a very long time. The locals require vehicular access to, along, and from the beach to provide heating for their homes as pedestrian access for firewood gathering is unrealistic. In a community characterised by high unemployment coupled with an aging population the ability to gather firewood from the beach is crucial as most residents cannot afford to buy firewood or to run electric heating. The implications of banning vehicular access to the beach are far reaching and the social cost of doing so would be high. We ask that the status quo be retained.







